Program Information

The Edison Scholars Program rewards public and private high school seniors who show potential for a successful college career and have financial need. The program supports the study of math, physics, chemistry, engineering, materials science, computer science or information systems with renewable scholarships at four-year colleges. The scholarship is part of Edison's longstanding tradition of investing in the future by making the dream of a college education a reality for deserving students.

This scholarship program is administered by Scholarship Management Services, a division of Scholarship America. Scholarship Management Services is the nation's largest designer and manager of scholarship and tuition reimbursement programs for corporations, foundations, associations and individuals.

Who is eligible?

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be a current high school senior with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent.
- Live in or attend a public or private high school in areas serviced by Southern California Edison (SCE) or attend an eligible high school in the designated area surrounding SCE's San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS). Consult the lists of eligible high schools below.

 - o Eligible Private High Schools
- Plan to attend an accredited four-year college or university in the U.S.
- Plan to enroll in full-time undergraduate study in one of the following eight (8) majors for the entire 2016-17 academic year:
 - o Electrical Engineering
 - Mechanical Engineering
 - Civil Engineering
 - o Computer Engineering
 - Industrial Engineering
 - Computer Sciences/Information Systems
 - Environmental Engineering
 - Environmental Sciences
- Demonstrate financial need.
