Now as a Los Angeles resident and Deputy Director of the youth literacy non-profit organization Get Lit–Words Ignite, Mason continues to pursue creative projects while helping to shape the future of spoken word poetry education in California and beyond. About Me

Born in a prison cell to an incarcerated mother and a father unknown, Christian D. Green has overcome many obstacles rare, atypical, and uncommon to others.

Christian David Green is a first generation, former foster youth, non-traditional graduate from the Antelope Valley, specifically Lancaster, California. Christian graduated spring 2016 from UCLA with a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology with a minor in African American Studies. And then Graduated with M.A. in African American Studies spring 2018 from UCLA. He currently serves as a national ambassador on the U.S. Truth Racial Healing and Transformation Coalition (US TRHT), serves as the Policy and Advocacy Director for Sanctuary of Hope that serves our TAY (Transitional Age Youth) Population, and as of Fall 2023 Christian has been hired on as the First African American Studies Professor at West LA Community College where he is building out the curriculum and the department. In 2018, he also released his first book - Uncovering Your Worth: From Legal Custody to UCLA which has allowed Christian to speak all over the nation about his own adventure within the child welfare system.





About Me

Maggie Lin is the Co-Founder and Executive Director of Foster Nation, a nonprofit that supports and empowers foster youth aging out of the system to become self-sufficient. Upon immigrating to the US from Taiwan, she ended up in the Los Angeles County foster care system for nearly a decade with her sister, moving through 6 different placements before the age of 18.

Maggie received her B.A. in Philosophy from Dartmouth College in 2011. She has lived overseas in Indiaand Mongolia, working for the Chairman of the IPCC (United Nations) and Nobel Laureate, Dr. Rajendra Pachauri; software technology company fighting counterfeit drugs in India and Southeast Asia, and other social impact startups. An introduction to the Pritzker Foster Care Initiative inspired her to dedicate her professional career to making an impact on those still affected by the foster care system.

Maggie has been featured in The Today Show, Los Angeles Times, KXN Hero of the Week, Fox 11 Los Angeles, Good Day LA, Foster Change, and other podcasts and interviews. She currently resides in Austin, TX.







TIFFANY HADDISH

Philanthropist, Actor, and Comedienne

Tiffany Haddish

Emmy & Grammy award winner Tiffany Haddish has established herself as one of the most sought-after comedic actresses and performers worldwide. Haddish can most recently be seen reprising her role as Detective Danner in the second season of AppleTV's critically acclaimed murder mystery series The Afterparty, in Disney's Haunted Mansion, MGM's Landscape With Invisible Hand, an adaption of MT Anderson's futuristic sci-fi novel, and Back on the Strip. Prior to this, she starred in Lionsgate's The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent opposite Nicholas Cage and Universal's Easter Sunday. Haddish also voiced the role of Tuca in Adult Swim's Tuca & Bertie and the role of Aisha in Hulu's Solar Opposites. Other recent projects include: starring opposite Oscar Isaac in the critically acclaimed Paul Schrader film The Card Counter, On the Count of Three, alongside Jerrod Carmichael and Netflix's critically acclaimed Bad Trip, starring alongside Eric Andre and Lil Rel Howery. Haddish's projects in development include Down Undercover, Mystery Girl, Homecoming Queen and The Untitled Flo Jo Biopic.

Haddish is perhaps best known for her breakout role in the smash comedy Girls Trip, where she starred as the scene-stealing "Dina" alongside Jada Pinkett Smith, Queen Latifah, and Regina Hall. Her other film and television work include Here Today, Like A Boss, The Kitchen, Between Two Ferns: The Movie, The Spongebob Squarepants Movie: Sponge on the Run, The Secret Life of Pets 2, The Lego Movie 2: The Second Part, The Angry Birds Movie 2, Night School, Nobody's Fool, The Oath, hosting both Kids Say the Darndest Things and TBS' Friday Night Vibes, Self-Made: Inspired by the Life of Madam CJ Walker, The Last O.G. and The Carmichael Show. Haddish also served as host and executive producer of the Emmy-nominated Netflix stand-up comedy series Tiffany Haddish Presents: They Ready. The series of half-hour comedy specials featuring her friends and long-time comedic collaborators ran for two seasons

Her Emmy-nominated and Grammy-winning comedy special, Tiffany Haddish: Black Mitzvah, debuted on Netflix in December 2019. Haddish became the second black woman ever to win a Grammy for Outstanding Comedy Album and the first since Whoopi Goldberg won in 1986. Her first stand-up special, Tiffany Haddish: She Ready! From the Hood to Hollywood was released on Showtime in August 2017. Just three months after the special's release, Haddish made history by becoming the first black female stand-up comedian to host Saturday Night Live, which earned her the 2018 Emmy Award for "Outstanding Guest Actress in a Comedy Series." In June 2018, Haddish took the reins as the host of the MTV Movie and TV Awards, a role that earned her critical acclaim and significant ratings boost for MTV..

TIFFANY HADDISH



Haddish's first book, a memoir called The Last Black Unicorn, was released in 2018. The book made the New York Times Best Sellers List, and the companion audiobook, narrated by Haddish, was nominated for a 2019 Grammy Award for "Spoken Word Album." In 2022 Haddish released her debut picture book Layla, The Last Black Unicorn.

Haddish's journey and life experiences have inspired her comedy and sense of humor both on and off the stage. She has been very candid about her experiences growing up in foster care in South Central Los Angeles. Her excessive talking and imaginary friends prompted her flustered social worker to steer her into stand-up comedy. She enrolled in the Laugh Factory's Comedy Camp, a place for at-risk and underprivileged children to transform negative energy into something positive. The experience was just the beginning of her comedy career. Haddish recently founded The She Ready Foundation to help and support foster kids in need. In 2021 The She Ready Foundation launched an Internship Program with Ready To Succeed for foster youth in the SoCal area.

She currently lives in Los Angeles.
