About Rainbow Labs







After-school Art focused program where LGBTQ+ youth share their stories, lead projects, and shape their community. Their ideas drive the program - and their voices lead the way.



Spring (1 Semester - 12 Weeks)


After-school STEM-focused mentorship program designed to address the underrepresentation of LGBTQIA+ individuals/youth in science and technology.

Run Club is twice a year for 7 weeks (Fall + Spring) in East Los Angeles.

Clinics are throughout Los Angeles County and are four times a year. Our LGBTQ+ Youth friendly sports clinics are done in partnership with youth development providers and schools throughout Los Angeles County. Each clinic runs for four hours. We bring in LGBTQ+ adults from sports leagues across Los Angeles County to help facilitate sports such as soccer, basketball, softball, dance, and much more.

All youth (LGBTQ+ and Allies) are welcome to participate.

We structure these clinics for ages 13+ (middle school and high school aged youth.) Our goal is to expose youth to the idea that the LGBTQ+ community embraces the important life skills (such as team work and friendship) that sports teaches us when facilitated in an emotionally safe environment.

Rainbow Labs is proud to be one of the five mentoring programs in the U.S. that focuses specifically on Queer and Gender Nonconforming youth. When looking for mentors we look for folks who want to show up, share their story, and help create something better.

You can be mentoring for the first time or have years of experience, your identity and lived experience matter! Together, we build safer, affirming spaces that many of us needed growing up.

Mentors are matched to programs based on their interests, experience and availability. Recruitment process includes Application, Interview Screening, Onboarding, and Training.

The Benefits Of Mentorship

01

LGBTQ+ youth who had at least one accepting adult in their life were 40% less likely to report a suicide attempt in the last year.

02

Affirming adults contribute to creating **safer** and **more inclusive** environments, in schools, community centers, or other settings.

03

This sense of safety and belonging can significantly improve mental health outcomes for LGBTQ youth

04

Supportive relationships with affirming adults help LGBTQ youth develop better coping mechanisms and resilience in the face of adversity.
